SETTING THE SCENE

» The University of Tennessee at Martin football team opens the 2022 season as defending Ohio Valley Conference league champions with a non-conference matchup against Missouri Valley Football Conference foe Western Illinois on Thursday, Sept. 1. Kickoff from Hardy M. Graham Stadium is scheduled for 6:30 p.m. and will be broadcast on ESPN+.

» UT Martin opens its 93rd season of football and 31st as a Division I program in 2022. The Skyhawks are 39-51-2 in season openers in the program's history – including a 2-3 mark against Football Championship Subdivision opponents under head coach Jason Simpson.

» The Skyhawks enter the season ranked No. 15 in the AFCA Coaches Top 25 and No. 18 in the Stats Perform Top 25. UT Martin is looking to build upon the program's second OVC championship in 2021 while posting a 10-3 overall mark and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Division I playoffs.

» UT Martin boasts three preseason All-Americans in center Matthan Hatchie, linebacker John H. Ford II and safety Deven Sims. Ford was also tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year. In total, the 2022 OVC preseason favorites had eight players garner preseason all-conference honors with Hatchie, Ford and Sims being joined by running back Zak Wallace, wide receiver Colton Dowell, offensive lineman Gavin Olson, offensive lineman Lamar Morgan and safety Oshae Baker.

» Entering his 17th season on the sidelines, Skyhawk head coach Jason Simpson possesses a career record of 100-80. The two-time OVC Coach of the Year ranks fourth in league history in career victories.

» Western Illinois opens its first season under the direction of head coach Myers Hendrickson in his return to his alma mater. The Fighting Leathernecks are looking to bounce back from a 2-9 campaign in 2021 with a reworked roster.

» Thursday's contest marks the second meeting between the two programs in series history and first since 2003. Western Illinois came out victorious in the previous meeting on Sept. 20, 2003 by a score of 56-0 in Macomb.

PLAYER TO WATCH

JOHN H. FORD II

88 TACKLES **5.0** TFL **4** INTS

Graduate linebacker **John H. Ford II** enters the season as the OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year while garnering All-American honors. Ford ranked second on the team with 88 tackles while also recording 5.0 tackles for loss and four interceptions.

SIMPSON MOVES UP OVC LEADERBOARD

» With a win against Missouri State, Skyhawk head coach **Jason Simpson** moved into fourth place on the OVC's all-time wins leaderboard. With 100 career victories, Simpson passed WKU's Jimmy Feix for fourth.

» Now in his 16th season at UTM, Simpson ranks as the longest tenured coach in the league while ranking first among active OVC coaches with 100 wins and is just the sixth head coach to spend at least 15 years at the same institution - joining Roy Kidd (EKU), Boots Donnelly (Middle Tennessee), Charles Murphy (Middle Tennessee), Bob Spoo (EIU) and Don Wade (TTU).

» In OVC play alone, Simpson has a career mark of 77-47 through 16 seasons, more than tripling the program's 20-win total which stretched through 14 seasons before his tenure. His 77 conference wins rank third in OVC history.

» The 2022 campaign is UT Martin's 93rd season of football despite suspending play during Great Depression (1933) and World War II (1942-45). The Skyhawks are in their 31st season at the NCAA Division I FCS level. UT Martin joined the NCAA Division I ranks in 1992 and have compiled an overall record of 142-205 with two Ohio Valley Conference titles (2006 and 2021) and one NCAA Playoff appearance (2006 and 2021) as a Division-I program.

DIPPING INTO THE TRANSFER PORTAL

» The Skyhawks added to a veteran return group this offseason by dipping into the transfer portal and acquiring talent. The Skyhawks brought in seven graduate transfer in defensive back **Andre Brackett** (Bryant), defensive back **Tyler Gore** (Georgia State), safety **Bradley Jones** (Tennessee), defensive back **Shaun Lewis** (Houston), jack **TJ Neal** (Wofford), kicker **Frankie Onate** (South Alabama) and safety **Ty Woods** (Delta State).

» UT Martin also welcomes in defensive end **JoJo Belgrave** (Pitt), quarterback **Cornelius Brown IV** (Georgia State), offensive lineman **Jason Easton** (Eastern Michigan), wide receiver **Jeremiah Edwards** (Chattanooga), offensive lineman **Nick Edwards** (Tennessee), tight end **Parker Floyd** (Incarnate Word), defensive back **Andrew Garwo** (Temple), defensive back **CJ Johnson** (Southern Utah), long snapper **Brett Kuczynski** (Louisville), wide receiver **Kyler Pearson** (Kansas), wide receiver **George Qualls, Jr.** (Akron), linebacker **Jaylon Sharpe** (Charlotte) and quarterback **Kody Sparks** (Bowling Green).

OVC SUPREMACY

» Since the 2006 season, UT Martin ranks as the winningest active member in the Ohio Valley Conference with 77 victories. After winning just 20 games in the team's first 14 years in the league, the Skyhawks are 77-47 since 2006 while sitting 10 wins above the closest program in Eastern Illinois (67-56) during that span. The Skyhawks have finished .500 or above in conference play in 14 of the last 16 seasons - including four top-two finishes during that span.

SKYHAWKS SOARING UP NATIONAL POLLS

» UT Martin opens the season ranked nationally in both major polls following its OVC championship and second round playoff run last year. The Skyhawks are ranked 15th in the preseason AFCA Coaches' Top 25 and 18th in the Stats Perform Top 25 heading into the season.

UT MARTIN PICKED TO FINISH FIRST IN OVC

» For the first time in program history, UT Martin was picked as the preseason favorites in the Ohio Valley Conference predicted order of finish by the league's head coaches and sports information directors as well as the Preseason Media Poll. The Skyhawks tallied 70 overall points and 10 of the 14 first place votes.

FORD NAMED TO BUCK BUCHANAN AWARD 2022 PRESEASON WATCH LIST

» UT Martin linebacker **John H. Ford II** has been named to the preseason watch list for the prestigious 2022 Buck Buchanan Award, which Stats Perform presents to the national defensive player of the year in college football's Division I subdivision.

» Ford is one of 35 players announced to the preseason watch list. Overall, 15 FCS conferences are represented on the list – including the 2021 Buchanan Award recipient Isaiah Land of Florida A&M, 2020 Buchanan Award recipient Jordan Lewis of Southern and 13 other past finalists.

» Ford became a dominating force for the Skyhawks in 2021 en route to All-OVC first team honors. He ranked second on the team with 88 total tackles while racking up four double-digit tackle performances. The playmaker also recorded four interceptions to rank tied for second in the OVC while returning a pick 75 yards for a touchdown against Tennessee State.

MATTHAN HATCHIE GARNERS NUMEROUS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN HONORS

» The preseason honors have rolled in for senior offensive lineman Matthan Hatchie after back-to-back All-OVC honors. So far this year, Hatchie has been named a consensus preseason All-American by Athlon Sports, Stats Perform, Lindy's Sports, The Bluebloods and Phil Steele. He was also ranked as the fourth-best returning offensive lineman in the nation by HERO Sports.

HATCHIE, FORD AND SIMS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS BY STATS PERFORM

» The Skyhawk trio of offensive lineman Matthan Hatchie, linebacker John H. Ford II and safety Deven Sims were named to the Stats Perform FCS Preseason All-American teams. Hatchie was tabbed to the first team while Ford and Sims garnered third team honors.

LINDY'S SPORTS NAMES DEVEN SIMS OVC PRESEASON DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

» Two-time All-OVC first team performer Deven Sims garnered a big offseason honor as Lindy's Sports picked the graduate safety as the OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in its yearly publication.

» Sims has been a consistent contributor in the Skyhawk secondary as a starting safety for the past three years while garnering back-to-back All-OVC first team honors in 2020 and 2021. During his career he has played in 38 contests while accumulating 194 tackles, 12.0 tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, 14 passes defended, four forced fumbles and one interception.

FORD AND HATCHIE NAMED TO PHIL STEELE FCS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN TEAMS

» The Skyhawk duo of offensive lineman Matthan Hatchie (second team) and linebacker John H. Ford II (fourth team) were honored by Phil Steele as 2022 FCS Preseason All-Americans.

LEWIS TABBED OVC PLAYER TO WATCH

» Houston graduate transfer cornerback Shaun Lewis was named to the 2022 OVC Newcomer to Watch List in conjunction with other preseason All-OVC honors as selected by the league's head coaches and sports information directors.

» Lewis joins the Skyhawks after spending five seasons at Houston where he played in 42 career games, tallied 39 tackles and notched 10 passes defended, an interception and a fumble recovery.

» The **Big South Conference** and the **Ohio Valley Conference** announced back in February that they have signed a letter of intent to create an association of their football member institutions, to begin with the 2023 NCAA Division I football season. The unique agreement combines the two conferences' football membership to ensure NCAA championship access. It will provide the football member institutions a schedule of games against all the teams in their multisport conference and additional games against schools from the other conference.

» After finishing as the league runner up three times (2008, 2012 and 2016), the Skyhawks reached their goal in 2021 season by winning the program's second OVC title and first since 2006.

UT MARTIN'S POSTSEASON SUCCESS

» UT Martin has played in the postseason five times in program history with appearances in the 1967 Tangerine Bowl, 1988 Division II playoffs and two berths in the NCAA Division I Championship in 2006 and 2021. The Skyhawks are 3-3 all-time in the postseason.

OVC'S RECENT PLAYOFF SUCCESS

» Beginning with the 2001 season the OVC went until 2013 without a FCS Playoff victory. But over the past nine seasons OVC teams have performed well in the playoffs, winning 13 total games and advancing to the FCS Quarterfinals three times in the past six seasons. In 2013 the OVC placed three teams in the field for the first-time ever (each won a game) and in 2015 the league had a team advance to the National Championship game (the first for the league since 1982). Over the past nine years six different OVC teams have won a playoff game.

FORMER SKYHAWK JAYLON MOORE SIGNS CONTRACT WITH NEW YORK GIANTS

» After spending the entire 2020 and 2021 seasons on the Baltimore Ravens practice squad, former Skyhawk wide receiver **Jaylon Moore** was signed by the New York Giants prior to the 2022 campaign.

FOUR SKYHAWKS SIGN PRO DEALS FROM 2021

» UT Martin had five players off its 2021 championship roster advance to professional opportunities. **Rodney Williams II** (tight end) signed an NFL undrafted free agent contract with the Denver Broncos while **Donnell Williams** (wide receiver) received invites to both the Tennessee Titans and Washington Commanders rookie minicamps. Meanwhile, quarterback **Keon Howard** (Edmonton Elks) and running back **Peyton Logan** (Calgary Stampeders) signed contracts in the Canadian Football League (CFL).

WALLACE HAS NOSE FOR THE ENDZONE

» After scoring just one touchdown in his freshman campaign, freshman running back **Zak Wallace** was no stranger to the endzone in 2021 as he tallied 15 rushing touchdowns - ranking third in the program's single season history. He not only led the OVC but ranked sixth nationally in rushing touchdowns and 10th in total touchdowns.

SKYHAWKS SET NEW TOUCHDOWN RECORD

» Featuring one of the top rushing attacks in the country, UT Martin was not shy about finding the endzone. The Skyhawks set a new program single-season record for rushing touchdowns in 2021 with 32, surpassing the previous record of 28 set in 2007. **Zak Wallace** led the team and ranked sixth nationally with 15.

KNOCKING OFF SOME OF THE NATION'S BEST

» With the team's road victories over No. 9 Jacksonville State (34-31) and No. 10 Missouri State (32-31), UT Martin picked up its first pair of wins over top-10 nationally ranked opponents in the same season in program history. The Skyhawks have picked up wins over nationally ranked foes 16 times since becoming a Division I program in 1992 - including three wins against top-10 foes including Central Arkansas (7, 2013), Jacksonville State (9, 2021), Middle Tennessee (10, 1993) and Missouri State (10, 2021).

SKYHAWKS WENT STREAKING

» The Skyhawks strung together a program-record nine game winning streak in 2021 which spanned 71 days from Sept. 11 after defeating Samford until snapping with a loss to Southeast Missouri on Nov. 20. The nine-game streak ranked as the longest winning streak in school history, surpassing the previous mark of eight set during the 1936, 1988 and 2006 campaigns.

ROAD WARRIORS

» UT Martin showed the ability to go on the road and leave with a win. The Skyhawks won four straight road matchups, picking up wins at Northwestern State, Jacksonville State, Eastern Illinois and Tennessee Tech to rank as the longest road winning streak since 2006. The team's five road wins are the most since 2013.

SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE PLAY

» UT Martin posted its best nonconference slate in its Division I history by going 5-2 while posting five FCS victories in 2021. The Skyhawks compiled three nonconference victories in as many weeks for the first time since joining the NCAA Division I FCS ranks in 1992 while their five wins marked the most since the 1988 season.

NO FLY ZONE

» The Skyhawks ranked second in the OVC and fourth nationally with 17 interceptions. **John Ford** and **Oshae Baker** lead the team with four interceptions each while seven other Skyhawks have tallied interceptions on the season. **Tevin Shipp** recorded the team's first defensive touchdown of the season with a 47-yard interception return against Murray State while Ford returned a season-long 75-yard interception for a touchdown against TSU.

DOWN BUT NOT OUT

» The Skyhawks showed the ability to overcome a slow start to a contest in 2021 after rallying from at least two-touchdown deficits against Samford (-17), Jacksonville State (-14) and Austin Peay (-16). During each of those games, the Skyhawks would respond with a run of their own to take control of the contest and never look back.

SGT. YORK TROPHY SERIES

» UT Martin took home bragging rights for the year and brought the Sgt. York Trophy back to west Tennessee for the first time since 2016 after going 3-0 in the annual trophy series last season with wins over Austin Peay (17-16), Tennessee State (41-20) and Tennessee Tech (42-3) by an average margin of victory of 20.3 points per game. The Skyhawks hold a 32-13 all-time record in the series - the best mark of the four Tennessee OVC schools.

» The Sgt. York Trophy series pits Tennessee members of the Ohio Valley Conference in a battle for state supremacy and ownership of the traveling trophy. UT Martin has claimed at least a share of the Sgt. York Trophy nine times - including four outright titles in 2010, 2014, 2015 and 2021.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

» UT Martin capped off the home portion of the 2021 regular season with a perfect record after knocking off Samford, Murray State, Southeast Missouri, Austin Peay and Tennessee State. After going 5-0 at home, the Skyhawks became just the 12th team in the program's 92-year history to have gone unbeaten at Graham Stadium.

WALLACE SCORES TOUCHDOWN TRIFECTA

» Freshman running back **Zak Wallace** broke free against Murray State for three rushing touchdowns in the win. Wallace joined select company, becoming the first Skyhawk to rush for three or more touchdowns in a single game since Abou Toure accomplished the feat against Murray State in 2014 while joining a list of just seven players in the program's Division I history who have combined to do it 13 times.

The longest tenured head football coach in the Ohio Valley Conference is Jason Simpson, who has transformed the University of Tennessee at Martin program into one of the winningest teams in the OVC since his first season in 2006.

In 16 years, Simpson has led UT Martin to an 100-80 record (.556 winning percentage) and a 77-47 mark against OVC opponents (.621 winning percentage). That comes after the program had won 20 OVC games in its first 14 seasons in the league. He also has presided over 120 All-OVC players after the program tallied 33 such players in its first 15 seasons in the OVC.

Simpson's 100 career victories rank fourth in OVC history while his 77 conference wins sits in third place.

Four of the program's eight 8-win seasons have come under Simpson, including all four at the Football Championship Subdivision level. He is responsible for the program's only OVC championship teams in 2006 and 2021. The 2006 team ended the season ranked No. 13 nationally with a 9-3 record while the 2021 team won the playoff game in the Division I Era while finishing the campaign ranked No. 12 nationally with a 10-3 overall mark.

Simpson is a four-time finalist for the Eddie Robinson FCS Coach of the Year Award in 2006, 2012, 2016 and 2021 while finishing fourth overall in 2006. He is also a two-time recipient of the OVC's Roy Kidd Coach of the Year award in 2006 and 2021 while being named the American Football Coaches Association Region 3 Coach of the Year in 2006, his debut season at UT Martin.

A total of 28 Skyhawks have been named an All-American under Simpson. A collection of those players include Alex Atkins (2006), Tony Bell (2013, 2014), Josh Bey (2009), Jessie Burton (2006), Jeremy Butler (2013), Don Chapman (2006), CJ Estelle (2011), Joe Gibbs (2009), Matthan Hatchie (2021), Montori Hughes (2012), Ben Johnson (2013), Dontrell Miller (2008), Quentin Sims (2012), Ray Williams (2008), Rodney Williams II (2020), Terry Williams (2019) and Josh Yarbrough (2007).

In April 2012, Hughes became the 12th UT Martin player and first since 1996 to be selected in the NFL Draft. Hughes was picked by the Indianapolis Colts in the fifth round (139th overall). Since 2011, Gibbs (St. Louis Rams, Green Bay Packers), Sims (Atlanta Falcons, New England Patriots), Derek Carr (New York Giants), Johnson (Kansas City Chiefs), Butler (Baltimore Ravens), DJ Roberts (Baltimore Ravens), Abou Toure (Indianapolis Colts), Charles Sweeton (Kansas City Chiefs), Bell (Tennessee Titans), Corey Jordan (Jacksonville Jaguars), Caylon Weathers (Chicago Bears), Brett Thompson (Pittsburgh Steelers), Joe Este (Tennessee Titans), Jaylon Moore (Baltimore Ravens), Donnell Williams (Tennessee Titans and Washington Commanders) and Rodney Williams II (Denver Broncos) have all received opportunities with NFL teams.

Simpson also coached Chapman for two seasons, who became just the 14th Division-I player to rush for 1,000 yards in four consecutive seasons. He was named the program's first-ever OVC Offensive Player of the Year in 2006.

The Skyhawks have won or shared the Sgt. Alvin C. York Trophy - which was established in 2007 and is given annually to the best of the four OVC teams located in Tennessee - nine times. The Skyhawks won the trophy in 2010 and shared it in 2012, 2018, 2019 and 2020 while claiming the trophy outright in 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2021. UT Martin owns a 32-13 all-time record in the Sgt. York Trophy series, which is the best mark out of the four OVC schools.

Prior to accepting his first head coaching job at UT Martin, Simpson was the offensive coordinator at the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga. He was instrumental in the resurgence of the UTC football program. In 2005, Chattanooga posted a 6-5 campaign, the school's first winning season since 1997.

Before Chattanooga, Simpson coached at Texas State University, a member of the Southland Football League. He coached quarterbacks, receivers and served as the team's recruiting coordinator. In 2000, Texas State posted a 7-4 record, the school's first winning season in 10 years.

Simpson served as an assistant coach from 1997-1999 at Jacksonville State University. He coached quarterbacks and was the team's passing game coordinator. He also coached receivers and served as an assistant special teams coordinator. He was a member of the Jacksonville State staff responsible for the third best turnaround in Division I football for the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

An Ellisville, Miss. native, Simpson signed as a quarterback with Mississippi State and played for two seasons for the Bulldogs. He also played baseball for Ron Polk at Mississippi State before transferring to Southern Miss in 1992. At Southern Miss, Simpson was a two-time all-conference selection in baseball and was team captain his senior season.

After earning a bachelor's degree in 1994 from Southern Miss, he spent the next year as a graduate assistant football coach at Delta State, where he coached defensive backs. In the spring of 1995, Simpson served as an assistant football and head baseball coach at Collins High School in Mississippi.

Simpson and his wife, the former Julie Wilkerson, have two sons and a daughter: Ty, Emma and Graham. The family lives in Martin and attends First Baptist Church.
